

There appears to be only one regulation contemplating any accommodation to persons licensed in other states (see 30 Code Miss. R. Pt. 1401, R. 1.2), **however there appears to be no meaningful set of regulations implementing these reciprocal licensing requirements.**

**Polygraph Examiner - License by Reciprocity:** An applicant who is a **polygraph examiner licensed** under the laws of another state or territory of the United States may be issued a license upon payment of a fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and **the production of satisfactory proof that:**

(1) He is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;

(2) He is a citizen of the United States;

(3) He is of good moral character;

(4) The requirements for the licensing of polygraph examiners in such particular state or territory of the United States were, at the date of the applicant's licensing therein, substantially equivalent to the requirements now in force in this state;

(5) The applicant had lawfully engaged in the administration of polygraph examinations under the laws of such state or territory for at least two (2) years prior to his application for license hereunder;

(6) Such other state or territory grants similar reciprocity to license holders of this state; and
